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PREFACE

The words included in this concordance are those referenced, defined, illustrated and explained in the footnotes of the Recovery Version of the New Testament. These are identified in the Recovery Version text with a superscript, e.g., John 1:1⁵, “God.” The entry on the word “God” in the concordance reads John 1:1^{1,2,3,4,5}, since exposition on the word “God” is also mentioned in footnotes 1, 2, 3, and 4, as well as in 5. This appears as God (*Theós*) in the Concordance under “Table of English Keywords.” The words in the text that are mentioned in the footnotes are listed alphabetically in this Concordance along with the corresponding Greek word. A second part of the Concordance, “Table of Greek Words,” lists all the Greek words and how each Greek word is translated in the Recovery Version. The Greek words are transliterated based upon the “Key to Transliteration and Pronunciation.” This Concordance follows the abridged one volume work by Geoffrey W. Bromiley, *Theological Dictionary of the New Testament* (“little Kittel”), Eerdmans, 1985. In his *Dictionary*, Bromiley does not use actual Greek words but gives their transliterated form.

For words not listed in Bromiley, the Greek concordance used was by G. Abbott-Smith, *A Manual Greek Lexicon of the New Testament* (T&T Clark, 1937) and Alfred Schmoller, *Pocket Concordance to the Greek New Testament* (German Bible Society, 1994).

A “Key to Transliteration and Pronunciation” is also included to help in the pronunciation of the transliterated Greek words and where the accent is placed. It should be noted that both the “e” and the “o” have a short and long form that affect the correct pronunciation of a particular word. For example, with the Greek word *lógos*, both “o’s” are short, whereas with the Greek word *rhéma*, the “e” is long.
